PHYSICAL INTERVENTION PRACTICUM 1 AND 2: As in previous ENTMA symposia/conferences, there will be a facilitated and structured Physical Intervention Practicum/Workshop in which participants explore the practical issues/concerns associated with the teaching and/or /application and/or supervision of physical interventions. The workshop on this occasion is structured into **two 'Physical Intervention Practicums'** the first of which will focus on **personal safety/disengagement** interventions and the **safe provision on personal/intimate care**; and the second practicum will focus on **containment/restraint** interventions.

Delegates should note that any and all physical interventions are presented in a structured protocol which takes cognisance of the inherent risks to all concerned. Delegates who wish to present specific interventions should contact Kevin McKenna at mckennakj@eircom.net in advance.
